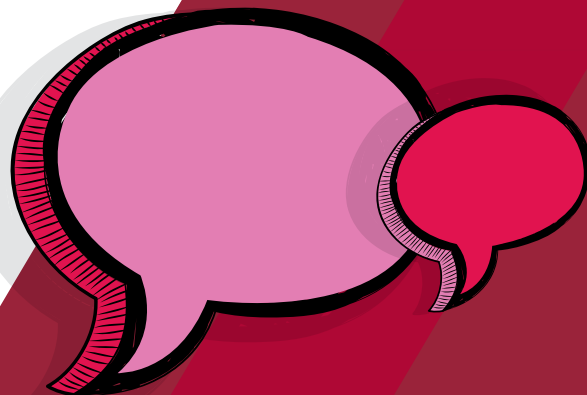

EMA

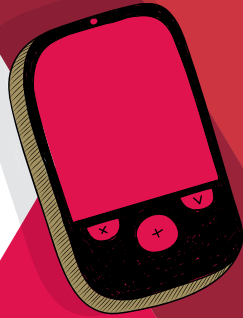
You may be eligible for the Educational Maintenance Allowance (EMA) which is a weekly allowance paid fortnightly.

Within the Aspire2Work course you will have an opportunity to gain employability skills through participating in work experience.



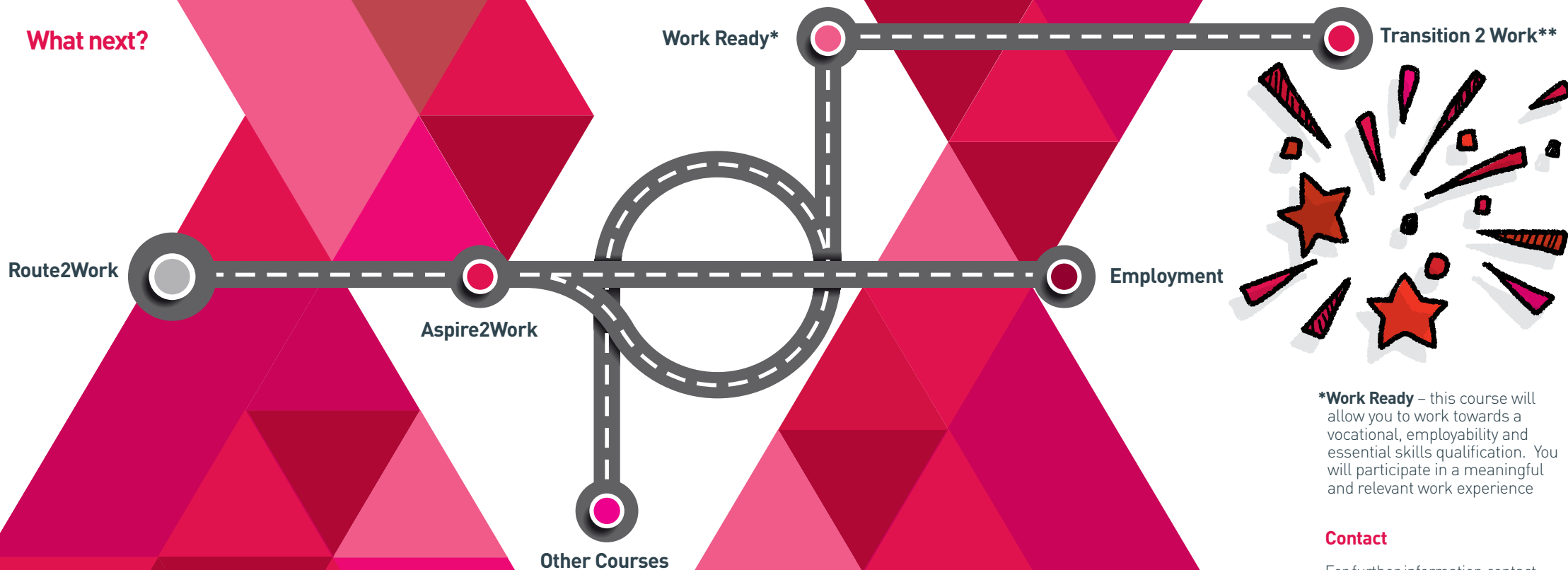
All applications must be submitted online. PC access available in libraries of all campuses.
